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Brintons returns to the St Pancras Renaissance Hotel

Kidderminster, UK - Brintons carpets has made a dramatic return to the newly-restored St

Pancras Renaissance Hotel in London - more than 10 years after it made creative history inside

the striking Gothic-Revival building.

In January 1999, Brintons was given special permission to use the Grand Staircase in the

derelict former Midland Grand Hotel building (now the St Pancras Renaissance) as the backdrop

for the photographs that were used in its groundbreaking 'some things in life wear better than

others' advertising campaign. The campaign was built around a series of elegant costumes that

were designed by Vivienne Westwood but unusually made from Brintons Axminster carpet.

Now, more than 10 years on, Brintons carpet is once again a dramatic feature inside the

luxurious hotel – this time as a stunning permanent floorcovering.

The Kidderminster-based company's reputation for delivering both high-class, contemporary

hospitality projects and period renovations meant it was specified to work alongside GA Design

and RHWL Architects to deliver 15,000 m2 of its premium-quality Axminster carpet for

installation at the 5-star Manhattan Loft Corporation property.

Brintons joined forces with GA design to develop suitable contemporary carpet designs that

would be installed in the main public areas, guest rooms, corridors, business and function suites

and private apartments at the hotel.

As well as being asked to design the historically accurate reproduction carpet that was required for the Grand Staircase, Brintons consulted with RHWL and then used its carpet design archive in Kidderminster to unearth material that could be used as inspiration when replicating the original carpet design from 1905.

The interior styling results at the newly-opened hotel have been breathtaking and the hotel is once again one of London's most spectacular properties.

Stephanie Backhouse, Senior FF&E Designer at GA Design International, said: "We work with Brintons regularly and have a good rapport with the company and it's design team. The carpets that Brintons supplied at the St Pancras Renaissance Hotel compliment the interior design by GA and sit comfortably with the highly decorative nature of this listed building."

Nicola Hewitt, Brintons Commercial Marketing Director, said: "When we stood on the Grand Staircase in 1999 to take our campaign photos, we couldn't help but admire the stunning architecture inside the building. We hoped that one day it would be restored to its period glory.

"Fast forward a decade and we've just played a significant part in bringing the property back to life as a stunning 5-star hotel. It's an amazing transformation and has been quite an emotional journey, having stood inside the derelict building in 1999 and seen it as it is now. We're extremely proud to have worked on such an exciting renovation project."

Brintons designed and supplied 12 individual carpet and rug designs to the St Pancras Renaissance Hotel project, all of which were sensitive to the period style and acclaim of the historic building.
